


Congregational Elections

Based on these the CRC has summarized the problems in 28 points.





The Synod accepted the CRC's interim account


- of the process of the two-level congregational and departmental – dialogue,
- then it supported the second committee proposal which was based on its evaluation.

The Synod decided that the CRC initiates consultation in the reported questions, involving experts and those who are concerned and in cooperation with the Synod Mission Committee (SMC).



Together with CRC members, the eight Working Groups of the so called "Mission Day" initiated earlier by the SMC developed the action plans of certain fields following a common method.
